Notice is given in accordance with statutory requirements that Rochdale Borough Council, Children's Services, Number One Riverside, Smith Street, Rochdale, OL16 1XU, intends to open a new satellite site for Raise Rochdale PRS.

5. What is proposed?

The proposal is to create a new satellite school site for Raise Rochdale PRS, to re-provide accommodation that is currently being delivered at a temporary site. The new site off Mayfield Street in Central Rochdale will provide 64 places from 1st September 2028 (the opening of the school building may be within the 2027/28 academic year, but the first full year is likely to be 1st September 2028).

6. School capacity and places- current pupil numbers and admissions- (distinguishing between compulsory and non-compulsory school age pupils), age range, sex, and special educational needs (distinguishing between boarding and day pupils) for whom provision is currently made:

Raise Rochdale PRS had 199 pupils on roll from Reception to Year 11 in the May 2025 school census. The current age range of the children is 5 to 16 years. The school is an alternative provision school and admits children who are unable to attend mainstream schools due to various challenges.

7. Why do we want to make the change(s)?

Reasons for the increase of places and choice of a larger satellite site:

- 7.1 Rochdale Council has a statutory duty under section 19 of the Education Act 1996 to provide suitable education for children of compulsory school age who cannot attend mainstream school.
- 7.2 Raise Rochdale PRS is a specialized educational school that caters to children who cannot attend mainstream school for reasons such as behavioural issues, medical conditions, or specific learning difficulties. Raise Rochdale's aim is to provide a supportive and structured environment where these students can continue their education tailored to their individual needs.
- 7.3 The council has a duty of care to manage school places effectively by working in partnership with schools and academy trusts so that schools can adequately staff their schools and so that additional classroom accommodation is provided in a timely manner.
- 7.4 Most children at Raise Rochdale PRS have some special educational need, although this is not a criterion for entry. The special educational needs and disability code of practice: 0 to 25 years is statutory guidance for organisations which work with and support children and young people who have special educational needs or disabilities. The guidance states that all children and young people are entitled to an appropriate education, one that is appropriate to their needs, promotes high standards and the fulfilment of potential.

This should enable them to:

- achieve their best
- become confident individuals living fulfilling lives, and
- make a successful transition into adulthood, whether into employment, further or higher education or training
- 7.6 Since 2014 the number of children in each year group cohort has increased and this increases the number of children requiring a PRS school place.
- 7.6 Raise Rochdale operates over three sites in Rochdale: the main school at Heights Lane, Saxon Hall and St Alban's House. The site at St. Alban's House is temporarily leased and the purpose-built school being discussed here will replace some of the school capacity currently being provided at St Alban's and Saxon Hall.
- 7.7 Raise Rochdale PRS provides specialist alternative provision places for children in both Primary and Secondary year groups.
- 7.8 Raise Rochdale is recently de-federated from a partnership with Rochdale's special school that provides SEND places for children with predominantly Social, Emotional and Mental Health issues. Under the previous federation the school was called Brownhill Learning Community.

Quality of Provision

- 7.6 The OfSTED report for previously federated school's collaborative, under the establishment title of "Brownhill Learning Community" was published in July 2024 and the school was judged to be "Requires Improvement" in all categories.
- 7.7 The advantages to the school and the children will be:
 - Greater curriculum offer for children needing vocational training in years 10 and 11.
 - Additional capacity to replace St Alban's House and to manage the ongoing growth in children requiring alternative provision (AP) schooling.
- 7.8 The Governing Body of Raise Rochdale Service is committed to upholding the standards and ethos of the School. Through the Leadership and Management Team and alongside the Governing Body, the school aspires to provide a 'Good' education to all of the children in its community.

8. The need for a increase in places - a statement and supporting evidence about the need for reducing school places in the area including whether there is sufficient capacity to accommodate additional pupils in the current schools:

A previous detailed review of SEND and places is also contained in the council's the <u>Education</u> <u>Sufficiency Strategy</u> which detailed the need for the additional secondary special school capacity that will be provided by this new satellite school.
