The assessment will seek to establish the effect of the proposal (i.e. the reduction of the contingency budget held by Community Safety and the reduction in funding for) on Crime and Disorder across the Borough. This assessment is work in progress and service activity data on the numbers of users of the service will be added as this becomes available.

7 a).What does the function currently do? b).Describe the needs which this service meets?

- The contingency budget is used to cover a range of operational issues (such as the costs of handling the recent far-right demonstrations, repairing CCTV equipment which goes faulty during the year, specific research and intelligence projects, and other statutory duties such as Domestic Homicide Reviews).
- ii) is a community provider of treatment for alcohol, offering a range of services to address all levels of problems for adult (over 18) users of alcohol. These include advice and information; workshops; social and leisure activities; counseling; support groups; and assistance with detoxification.

8. What changes do you propose to make?

i) Reduce the contingency budget by £30k.

ii) Reduce the funding paid to by £16k.

In general terms, in June 2011 the Royal College of Psychiatrists reported the findings of an Older People's Substance Misuse Working Group which revealed that alcohol misuse is a growing problem among older people. Professor Ilana Crome, Professor of Addiction Psychiatry and Chair of the Older People's Substance Misuse Working Group of the Royal College of Psychiatrists stated: "The traditional view is that alcohol misuse is uncommon in older people, and that the misuse of drugs is very rare. However, this is simply not true.
 - A third of older people with alcohol use problems develop them in later life often as a result of life changes such as retirement or bereavement, or feelings of boredom, loneliness and depression.
 - Older people often show complex patterns and combinations of substance misuse e.g. excessive alcohol consumption as well as inappropriate use of prescribed and over the counter medications.

On 11 September 2012 the problem of under-aged drinking was highlighted in the press. Data produced by the National Treatment Agency for Substance Misuse (NTA) identified Lancashire as the worst area for this issue.
