This assessment seeks to set out the impact of the proposal to reduce the book fund. It is not considered that the proposal has an unequal impact on any protected group.

# 7 a). What does the function currently do?

#### b). Describe the needs which this service meets?

The book fund is used to buy books and related library resources (CDs, subscriptions, DVDs, talking books etc). The library service has a statutory responsibility to ensure a comprehensive service, which includes ensuring that there are adequate stocks to cover the borough's 17 libraries, housebound and mobile services.

### 8. What changes do you propose to make?

This proposal seeks to reduce the fund by £38,000, leaving an annual budget from which to buy books and related materials of £200,000 from 2013/14. This allows us to replace/refresh approximately 6% of the library stock annually.

In order to minimise the impact of this cut, it is proposed to stop lending DVDs and CDs on the basis that this is an expensive service for the library to run, has limited public benefit and alternative, cost effective commercial provision is available. This proposal will not however affect talking book stock which will continue to be bought as before.

#### 9. Who are the key stakeholders who may be affected by the changes proposed?

Library service users will be affected by this proposal as it will mean that they are no longer able to access DVDs and CDs through the library service.

#### 10. What impact will this proposal have on all the protected groups

#### **Race Equality**

There is expected to be no unequal impact on this group. Books will continue to be made available in the World Books Collection, via the current method of loan collections from Bright Books. This means people from new and emerging communities will not be disproportionately affected.

#### **Disabled People**

There is expected to be no unequal impact on this group. The procurement of talking books will be unaffected by this proposal.

#### Carers

There is expected to be no unequal impact on this group.

#### Gender

There is expected to be no unequal impact on this group.

#### Older and Younger People

There is the potential for there to be a small impact on this group. The library currently charges a small fee for the rental of DVDs and CDs. Although commercial provision is available at roughly the same cost, this often involves a contract of some sort (e.g. signing up to a film download site or postal service for example), which may disadvantage people who cannot afford a regular payment. There are providers (e.g. Blockbuster) that do not have this requirement however, but they may be less accessible to those without transport. Overall, the rental of DVDs and CDs is not considered an essential service, so the overall impact is expected to be low.

CDs and DVDs are not considered an essential council service and not having them in place will not present significant disadvantage.

Possible Adverse Impact	Mitigation Measure
Lack of availability of CDs and DVDs	Ensure that all staff in the service are trained to make customers aware of alternative provision and how to access this.

### What evidence do you have which demonstrates that these measures will be effective?

The commercial market is very well developed which suggests that it is a sustainable alternative to that provided by the library service. The costs charged by commercial operators are similar to the costs charged by the library service for this provision.
