# CONSULTATION PAPER Need for Extra Secondary School Places from September 2018 until September 2027 in BOROUGH SUMMARY



To: Parents and carers of children in Heywood, Middleton, Pennines and Rochdale Townships, Headteachers, staff and governors of all schools in the Townships, Township Councillors, Secretaries of Recognised Trades Unions, Manchester and Salford Dioceses, The Methodist Church, Local MPs, Youth MP and Youth Cabinet.

#### 1. What is this Letter about?

The Local Authority is looking at how many extra Secondary School places are going to be needed in the next few years for each new Year 7 group. The reason for this letter is to tell you how many extra places are likely to be needed in Heywood, Middleton, Pennines and Rochdale Townships, and to ask your views about where extra places should be provided.

#### 2. How many children are expected in future and how many places are needed?

In recent years there has been an increase in the number of children born in Rochdale Borough, and this increase in numbers will move through to the secondary sector. The demand for places is affected by cross boundary movement with significant numbers of Rochdale children seeking places at schools outside the borough. The projected pupil numbers reflect these trends.

## 3. What do you take into account to decide where to put extra places?

The Local Authority has to make sure there are enough school places for all children who need them. In deciding the number of extra places needed, it is assumed that all current Year 7 places will be filled. The Authority has taken into account a number of factors to decide where to put extra places, these are:- past trends in numbers of children moving from Year 6 to Year7, physical space in schools; scope to put in extra accommodation; and avoiding creating too many extra places in the long term.

## 4. How many places are there at each school now?

There are twelve secondary schools in Rochdale Borough. Already an extra 30 places are available at Kingsway Park and Falinge Park from 2017. The places available in 2018 are:

## 5. How will you put extra space into schools and how will you avoid overcrowding?

It is expected that most schools would need additional accommodation in order to admit further children. For new school proposals accommodation will be in accordance with Government guidelines on space in schools.

# 6. <u>Where are you thinking of putting extra new places?</u>

Extra capacity is definitely needed for 2019 and 2023/24 and will also be needed in the intervening years to enable in-year moves. Current spare capacity has been 4 FE across the borough and even with this spare local pressures have still be felt. Above the extra two schools all secondary schools will need to be approached to provide extra capacity.
