Need for Extra Secondary School Places from September 2018 until September 2027 in HEYWOOD and MIDDLETON TOWNSHIPS




To: Parents and carers of children in Heywood and Middleton Townships, Headteachers, staff and governors of all schools in the Townships, Township Councillors, Secretaries of Recognised Trades Unions, Manchester and Salford Dioceses, The Methodist Church, Local MPs, Youth MP and Youth Cabinet.

1. What is this Letter about?

The Local Authority is looking at how many extra Secondary School places are going to be needed in the next few years for each new Year 7 group. The reason for this letter is to tell you how many extra places are likely to be needed in Heywood and Middleton Townships, and to ask your views about where extra places should be provided.

2. How many children are expected in future and how many places are needed?

In recent years there has been an increase in the number of children born in both Townships, and this increase in numbers will move through to the secondary sector. The demand for places is affected by cross boundary movement with significantly more children taking up places in Heywood and Middleton secondaries than attend Primary schools in the areas. There are currently 6% more Year 7 children in Middleton and Heywood secondary schools than were in Year 6. There is also now a significant inward movement into Middleton schools mainly from Manchester. The projected pupil numbers reflect these trends.

3. What do you take into account to decide where to put extra places?

The Local Authority has to make sure there are enough school places for all children who need them. In deciding the number of extra places needed, it is assumed that all current Year 7 places will be filled. The Authority has taken into account a number of factors to decide where to put extra places, these are:- past trends in numbers of children moving from Year 6 to Year 7, physical space in schools; scope to put in extra accommodation; and avoiding creating too many extra places in the long term.

4. How many places are there at each school now?

There are five secondary schools in Heywood and Middleton Townships. Already an extra 30 places have are to be available at each of Cardinal Langley RC and Holy Family RC CE College, and an extra 10 places at St Anne's Academy for 2017. The places available in 2018 will be:

5. How will you put extra space into schools and how will you avoid overcrowding? It is expected that most schools would need additional accommodation in order to admit further children. For new school proposals accommodation will be in accordance with Government quidelines on space in schools.

6. Where are you thinking of putting extra new places?

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Options	Proposal for 2018: i) Provide an additional 30 places at Siddal Moor in existing accommodation. Proposals for 2019 onwards: ii) Consult on an additional 30 (60 total) places at Siddal Moor by extending school iii) Establish a new 180 place Free school in the Middleton area by 2020.
