We have used the local newspaper to raise awareness in the Forum, there has been an article in Lancashire Life on Littleborough which made considerable reference to the Forum and we have posted leaflets in local shops and notice boards advertising the Forum at the various stages up to this point.

While the present membership has a diversity of knowledge there are certain sections of the population which still need to be attracted to the Forum i.e. clergy, medical profession (doctors, nurses etc.), young people etc. It will be a continuing effort on our part to gain more members, particularly if we can successfully obtain some funding to help in this.

I believe that the legal requirements for a neighbourhood forum as expressed in the conditions contained in section 61(f) of the 1990 Act are satisfied within the Constitution.

However I would confirm that the neighbourhood forum will have the express purpose of promoting or improving the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of the Littleborough Area and that it will reflect the character of the area in general terms. Furthermore, that membership is open to people living and working in the area and elected members for the area and that, as stated above, the minimum number of 21 members has already been achieved and surpassed. These and future members will consist of a membership drawn from different places in the area and different sections of the community.
