

Design Statement

Station Square will provide an important and much needed space for local communities and is an exciting opportunity to develop a new civic space to the north of the railway station that can create an enhanced gateway experience to the town, act as a catalyst for investment in the station area, and support the wider regeneration strategy of the town and borough.

The scheme is made up of 2 distinctive character typologies:

- Streets and;
- Square

Streets

These will be pedestrian prioritised routes with and traffic calmed through design. Low kerbs, narrowed carriageways, widened footways and clear movement routes are proposed. High quality block materials, tree planting and integrated Sustainable Urban Drainage (SUDs) in the form of rain gardens will create decluttered green corridors connecting the Milkstone community to the space. Vehicle parking, loading, access and circulation is incorporated into the design. Taxi ranking is relocated to Station Road (east) as is the bus stop. Thresholds between the streets/Square create a transition point to mark the changing character and

The space hosts both activity and movement.

emphasise arrival within the square.

Bus circulation still to be explore.

Movements are simplified, reducing conflict points and prioritising pedestrians. Navigation is clear with natural wayfinding driving layout and design. A controlled access and bus route is incorporated within the square along Maclure Rd. Materials are small scale block units and coloured/ textured poured materials that provide a pedestrian character to the square. Tree Planting/Greening helps to separate modes, adds SUDs and provides sustainability/environmental/biodiversity value.

A plaza is divided in to parts supporting both passive and formal activity. Bespoke furniture clearly defines the space, protecting and controlling movement flows. These provide unique, distinctive and strong features within the space. Outside Nye Bevin house a community garden provides space for informal dwell, meeting friends and health exercise. The space provides a positive heritage setting. Next to the station a more open, flexible area provide a stage for events and activation.. Tree planting humanises scale, creates natural sculpture and seasonal interest.

Design Features:

Viaduct

The Viaduct walls provide a canvas for local street art and green wall panels which connect the platform park to the square physically and visually.

Surface Materials

Paving materials used to replace the current surface treatments, providing a cohesion across the square that promotes a pedestrian-first environment and community focus, whilst integrating the Metrolink and reflecting the local heritage

Tranquil Green Space

Located in the existing landscaped area outside Nye Bevan House, increased community use, providing a positive heritage setting

Proposed Tree Planting

Tree planting to help define the spaces within the Square, assist with the wayfinding and navigation, humanise the scale, integrating and expanding biodiversity and ecology

Activated Edges and Active Space

Ground floor space immediately outside existing and proposed developments, opportunity to activate space and create a sense of ownership by businesses, provide on-going activity in the Square, maximising sunny spots

Street Furniture & Structures

The provision of street furniture that not only facilitates the interaction of communities, but also assists with wayfinding and navigation, further define the spaces for activity and screening where required, be part of the public art strategy

Special Features

Public art is incorporated within a fulcrum feature along the axis of Lower Tweedale St. An urban feature integrated into the

Heritage Assets






